But as well as lots of our members appreciating the Labyrinth experience, it was wonderful to welcome folks from outwith the church. Some people (with no church connections whatsoever) had seen it advertised in the local press and had been intrigued enough to come along and try it out. Some of those folks described themselves as 'not

religious' but interested in 'spirituality.' Sadly, for too long, such people have looked anywhere but to our churches to further their

interest. And, further still, we had some come in to Labyrinth who just happened to be passing and saw – thanks to the glass doors – that something was going on.

All in all, there were enough plus points to convince us that having the church open in this kind of way is something that we will look to do more of in the time ahead. If you didn't get the opportunity this time around, make sure that you don't miss out next time!

Dear Friends,

It hardly seems like six months since we've been back in our beautifully-refurbished buildings! I don't know about you but I still get something of a buzz when I walk into the welcome gallery or into the sanctuary itself and see again what a wonderful job has been done. As everyone says, far from spoiling the church, we've enhanced it! It still retains the sense of *sacred* and yet it has all the attributes of a modern, flexible space – the perfect combination for furthering the worship and witness of the congregation.

Though pride is to be avoided – coming as it usually does before a fall! – there's a deal of pleasure to be had in showing visitors around the buildings. Seeing how others appreciate what's been done helps me to appreciate it all over again.

But here's the thing; re-doing our buildings was never an end in itself. We've made that clear throughout the various stages of the project and will continue to do so. Rather, it was about providing for ourselves a means of progressing the mission of the church.

That's why I'm so delighted then that we're seeing signs of that taking place. We have people coming into our buildings for the first time – some of them to share in our worship, others of them to take advantage of one or other of our midweek ministries. In terms of worship, as has been written elsewhere, wasn't it wonderful to see the church bursting at the seams on Easter Day! And through the week? Well, the Parent and Toddler Group is going from strength to strength and, by way of one more example, earlier this week (at time of writing) we welcomed forty-five young men and women into our *Havilah* drop-in on one single day.

We're making it abundantly clear that our church is not a closed shop or a *holy huddle* but the kind of place into which everyone is welcome and where anyone can find a home.

I've never doubted for a minute that we made the right decision in going ahead with the refurbishment. It's required a huge effort – not least by Ken Miller, Project Leader, who still continues – six months on! – to oversee the final stages to ensure that all loose ends get tied up. But it's an effort that will, I'm sure, reap rich rewards in terms of the future health and well-being of the congregation and its mission.

So there's plenty to rejoice in and to look forward to. If you've been away for a while, why not try to get yourself back on board. we'd love to see you and to have you part of all that's going on.

Malawi News

As most of you know one of the main projects for the Malawi 09 team was to renovate a building at Namisu in order to open a clinic. As well as building work, painting and installing solar power, we also had the building plumbed so that we could have running water. To that end we left money to sink a borehole nearby. Unfortunately they have been unable to find water in the area around the clinic. We are now seeking to drill to 60m which is double the normal depth, in an attempt to find the necessary water. Although this will cost an extra £1,000 we felt that it was important to try by all means to finish the clinic properly. Please pray that this will be successful!

They are beginning to start harvesting the crops. Early signs is that this is not going to be great but please pray that there will be adequate amounts.

Becky is going to Malawi on 17th May for 3 weeks – that's if the volcano calms down! As well as visiting friends she will be checking up on the progress of our projects, starting to plan for the Malawi 2011 visit and also starting to set up from that side our Child Sponsorship Scheme.
